



Supporting the Return of Student Events

Campus Services supports student events by awarding its BuzzFunds allocation to registered student organizations and campus departments that seek additional funding to enhance their events and allow students to engage with the campus community.

Fiscal Year 2022's return to "normal" on-campus events meant that BuzzFunds received more requests from student organizations than in the past two years of the pandemic. Events were back and in (mostly) full-swing. BuzzFunds saw the return of more cultural events and events specifically for graduate students than in FY21.

We were able to remove the COVID-19 event approval piece from our request form, as campus guidelines were relaxed more from the prior year. Students were once again encouraged to have their event outdoors, but did not need to seek approvals related to COVID-19 safety measures for their events.

This year the BuzzFunds request process focused on how BuzzFunds can support the Georgia Tech Strategic Plan through supporting student events. The request form asked event planners to select which of the nine values of Georgia Tech they feel that their event will help to support and achieve. Requestors were allowed to select as many of the values as they felt applied. BuzzFunds will continue to measure this moving forward, but will allow event planners to select the one value they feel is most supported by their event.

Requests were again due on the first Monday of the month and would be decided upon on a monthly basis. The requests went to a group of Campus Services employees to vote on the events based on the items requested for funding. Then the requests would go to Associate Vice President for Campus Services Kasey Helton to make the final determination.


Supporting the Strategic Plan

New this year to the BuzzFunds request form was a question for event planners to indicate the Strategic Plan Value that event planners felt their event best supported. Requestors could select as many of the nine values that they felt applied to their event. Most selected more than one category, so the data does not add up to the 81 total events that were funded.

Of the 81 events that BuzzFunds allocated funding to this year, the requests showed that the number one Georgia Tech value that BuzzFunds-funded events tended to support was "We nurture the well-being of our community." 69 events reported that their event supported this value within Georgia Tech's nine values. The second most prevalent value reported was "We thrive on diversity," with 58 of the event planners indicating that their events support this value. And the third most reported value in BuzzFunds-funded events was, "Students are our top priority," with 57 event planners selecting this value for their event.

With mostly students completing the request form for events that they are planning, though this is not always the case with some departments requesting funding for student events, the values selected for these events paint a picture about what students feel is the purpose of events for the Georgia Tech student community.

In the future, BuzzFunds plans to ask students to select the one value that they feel will most be supported by their event. In doing this in FY23, BuzzFunds will be able to determine the amount of the BuzzFunds allocation that was given to support each value. With several values selected this year, the data does not support being able to tell how much money was allocated toward which Georgia Tech Strategic Plan Value.






Students participate in "Night Market" hosted by International Ambassadors at Georgia Tech

BREAKDOWN OF EVENT CATEGORIES

In FY22, Campus Services was able to award a total of \$149,697 to student organizations and departments for 81 events held from August 2021 to April 2022. Of the 81 events that were funded, the greatest amount of events funded were in the Student Life category of events with 35 Student Life events funded. Likewise, Student Life events also had the highest amount of dollars allocated toward these events with \$83,063 given to Student Life events.



When breaking down the categories by amount funded, Student Life also was the greatest category with \$83,063. From there, the next most funded category was Culture with \$35,376 and Health and Wellbeing with \$16,129. This data is very much in line with the financial breakdown by category from the

previous fiscal year FY21.

Financials by Event Category

Not all \$149.697 that was awarded was actually spent after the award was given. Several events were cancelled or over estimated their expenses. Events where outside vendors or venues were a crucial part of the plan saw several cancellations. As a result, BuzzFunds was able to award more money than the annual allocation, because event planners informed us that they would not be using their award. We were then able to reallocate that funding to other groups.




